### Chairman's Message

In January I travelled to Kenya to visit 19 alumni of our BOAT/Bicton training course in Institutional Management & Business Planning who have formed their own network which they have called "BOAT Kenya". After a two day meeting in Nairobi I travelled to the home bases of their 10 organisations to see their work in the field. The itinerary - entirely planned by them including transport and accommodation - took me to the Mount Kenya area (Embu, Meru, Nanyuki, Laikipia, Nyeri) in central Kenya as well as Kisumu, Kimilili and Bondo in the west near Lake Victoria. It was inspiring to see them at work and witness the positive changes they are bringing about in their communities. It was also very

gratifying to hear the value that they all placed on the BOAT UK training and their enthusiasm to continue the link and develop their own BOAT Kenya programme which we are busy assisting them with. Our Uganda programme is also shaping up.

We will not be holding the UK course this year while we formalise and carry out in-country training supporting these exciting initiatives from East Africa which come as a direct result of the highly successful BOAT course accredited by Plymouth University. However, we intend to hold this course again in 2019.

Raising funds to support the UK course and these developments continues to be a priority and I would like to thank all our numerous supporters who willingly volunteer their time and energy to allow us to continue with our mission of helping people less fortunate than ourselves.

With degrees in Geography from Cambridge and Agricultural Economics from Oxford, John spent 27 years overseas working with Huntings in Pakistan, 1961-65, before becoming Chief Farm Management Officer in Zambia, 1967-72. He then served as a Principal Agriculturalist with the World Bank from

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1972-88 followed by short term consultancy principally for the International Fund for Agricultural Development, IFAD, in Rome (on project review, extension and research management and helping establish the Global Forum on Agricultural Research) and also for the EC and the Commonwealth Secretariat.

As a Trustee of BOAT John was instrumental in establishing the link with Tengeru Livestock Training College in Tanzania as well as lecturing on the BOAT/Bicton training course. We will miss his enthusiasm and wisdom based on huge development experience and philanthropy.

## **BOAT Kenya**, a Boost for Agricultural Communities in Kenya

Kenya is set to reap from years of BOAT UK training, which has yielded up to 20 Kenyan alumni with skills in Institutional Management and Business Planning (International). This follows the successful joint planning involving BOAT UK and BOAT Kenya. completed in January 2018, to establish a similar training programme in Kenya.

With the objective of boosting their contribution to development of the agriculture sector, BOAT UK alumni from Kenya formed BOAT Kenya to provide them with a framework for cooperation. BOAT Kenya is hosted at Environment Liaison Centre International (ELCI) offices in Nairobi.

Agriculture employs over 40 per cent of Kenyans, and over 70 per cent of Kenya's rural population. The sector accounts for 65 per cent of export earnings, and provides livelihood (employment, income and food security needs) for more than 80 per cent of Kenyans. This scenario inspired the mission of BOAT Kenya, which is to improve livelihoods and reduce poverty in rural populations in Africa, through providing high quality training in Institutional Management, Human Capital Development, Sustainable Agriculture and Natural Resource Management concerned with sustainable methods of food production and wider aspects of rural development.
