As always, BOAT's major partner Bicton College has continued to provide valuable support even as it completed its merger with The Cornwall College Group. Needless to say our Trust would not be able to carry out its programme without enthusiastic volunteers, numerous fund raising activities and generous donations and I would like to thank all of you for your support.
