Chairman's Message

With the COVID-19 Pandemic raging we sadly had to postpone our 2020 BOAT training course in early March. After months of careful planning and selection our excellent candidates from Kenya and Uganda were due to arrive in the UK on April 22nd to begin their six week intensive, fully residential course in Institutional Management, Business Planning and Communications (International) based at Bicton College.

One positive feature to emerge from this year's aborted course has been the strength of our partnerships, particularly in Kenya and Uganda. BOAT now has a substantial network of alumni from past training courses, many of whom have reached senior positions in their smallholder agricultural and rural development organisations in East Africa. In Kenya they have formed their own BOAT Kenya network. It was these partner organisations which carried out all the identification, screening and visa documentation mentoring of suitable candidates for the planned 2020 course based on their own experience of the training. Strengthening and deepening these partnerships bodes well for the future as more training and technical support is delivered in-country by BOAT.

We are again indebted to Chris Mitchell and his engineering students at Bicton who have rehabilitated a classic tractor in their own time to raise funds for BOAT with the support of our sponsors (see footnote). We have also been assisted by The Prince of Wales's Charitable Foundation as well as fundraisers like marshalling at The Grizzly Run. To all our supporters I say THANK YOU!

Meanwhile I wish you all, and particularly our African friends, good health and STAY SAFE.

Once again a huge thank you to all who have been involved in this project.



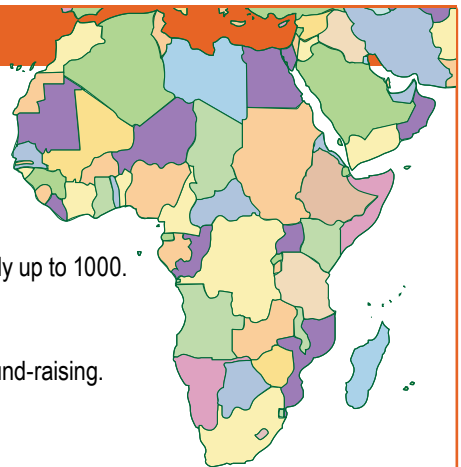
African Anecdotes
